BAN ON USE OF PLASTIC

Date: 01-12-2018

Place: Tarbanahalli, Bengaluru

Objective:

1.To create awareness in village on the ban of plastic to protect environment

2. To increase the public understanding and help the community perceptions on the dangers of plastic pollution

NSS unit of Mallige College of Pharmacy has organized Ban on the use of Plastics in nearby village (Tarbanahalli) on 01-12-2018. NSS volunteers visited the village and created awareness on the ban of plastic usage and created awareness by going to homes on the dangers of usage of plastics and also how it impacts the environment. Single-use plastic items such as plastic bottles, bags, spoons, straws and cups are banned completely, and awareness is created among staff and students through orientation and display boards in the premises. To restrict the use of plastic, measures have been taken to replace plastic teacups and glasses with steel glasses in the canteen. The staff and students are informed to use steel or copper water bottles instead of plastic bottles. Even NSS volunteers cleaned the village by removing plastics available in the streets of the village to create awareness. Around 30 NSS Volunteers have took part in the green initiative beyond the campus in nearby village. The Head of the Institution appreciated the efforts of NSS team of members.
